CANSTRUCTION PROJECTS BUILT BY CHURCHES, SERVICE CLUBS AND BUSINESSES

During late winter each year the pantry experiences occasional weeks when meat isn't available. During this time we try to procure canned meat by either purchasing it or inviting service clubs to donate canned meat to the pantry. This year our canned food purchases will be supplemented thanks to a project initiated by Habitat for Humanity.

In the CANstruction Project, organizations and businesses competed in late January to see who could build the coolest structure using canned food. The

contest took place at Carnation Mall and creative Canstructions showcased local creativity. In the end, six designs were built using a total of 2,550 cans of food which

were donated to the pantry after remaining on display for a week.

The winning design was Lowe's, whose team used 600 cans of tuna and Campbell's soup to build an American flag. Taking second place was Mount Union's Green Raiders who designed a tree using 323 cans of food, and third was the Alliance Kiwanis Club with their "K" logo design using 380 cans of tuna and 72 cans of soup. Also participating were Consumers National Bank whose "\$" design contained 450 cans of food, Atlercare of Alliance whose umbrella used 226 cans, and Well Spring Bible Church whose

wishing well used about 500 cans of beans and potatoes.

Judges were Mayor Alan Andreani, Mark Locke of the Chamber of Commerce, and Jody Koenigseker, president of the Pantry board. The day's activities soon are being featured in a segment on Alliance City School's Channel 11. The Pantry salutes all the businesses, churches, and service clubs who participated.
