Ever wonder what the Board of Directors for the Pantry does? There are 18 members on the board, six from original founding organizations and twelve at-large. The at-large members serve three year terms so that there are always new members learning the pantry organization and procedures. Because the pantry doesn't have any paid director or employees, the board must assume the jobs usually done by employees, like completing reports, handling publicity and writing grants. Unlike some boards, members of the pantry board commit to being "working members," that is, they know they will be asked to assume an active role in some aspect of the board. Some work a shift, some head committees like transportation, facility, operations or food, and all are responsible for making decisions about procedures and spending for the pantry.

The board meetings are held at the First Christian Church, one of the founding organizations, on the third Monday of each month at 4:30 pm (exceptions are Dec. and August).
