For those of you who are Facebook Friends of the Pantry, you were treated to a feature early in June during which Mike Patterson, Facebook liaison, highlighted each of the shifts



SCREENERS PREPARE FOR YEARLY REGISTRATION CHECK IN JULY

All of the screeners, under the guidance of Carol Henry, assembled in late June to discuss the registration process and hear of any changes this year. When arriving at the pantry, clients will have to provide a photo ID, preferably a drivers license, and a proof of residence, by showing any piece of official mail delivered to their current address. Clients will be required by the state to report any changes in household such as address, phone number, or members of the household. They also will be asked to provide additional information such as race, any disabilities, and if they receive food stamps.

Proxies -- those who pick up food for another client -- must bring his or her own ID, plus the client's ID and proof of residence.
