

CAMPUS PANTRY


Less than two months into the school year, the Raiders Cove is making a difference for many Mount Union students. The facility, which started as a food pantry, first opened in the fall of 2019 by two

student AmeriCorps members, and it continues to be overseen by four AmeriCorps students, seen here -- Julia Polyak, Justin Sturgill, Hayley Maher and Jon Starek. Raiders Cove, located on the north end of King Hall, now also offers help with clothing, hygiene products, as well as food and other items.

Last year they also started a Grab-and-Go snack initiative, which has been popular, where students can help themselves to snacks put out in locations around campus.
