- * we received: 6,280 pounds of food from Mount Union's annual Halloween collection;

- * Ohio State Extension office in Massillon gave us more than 650 nutritious OneMeal packs;

- * every day we are open we receive baked goods from Panera Bread;
- * twice a week we received donations from Aldi; and
- * every Sunday we received bakery items from Giant Eagle. And so many more.
