WHAT DO OUR STATISTICS SAY ABOUT THE NEED?

A comparison of the last four years tells us many things our volunteers are aware of - our client numbers are down; the number of households we serve is down, the number of individuals we serve is down, and the number of new clients is down. What does this mean? Is there still a need for the pantry?

In 2021:

- * We served 1,192 households and 3,507 individuals in those households.
- * 7,418 times people were given food.
- * We had almost 100,000 pounds of food donated by our business and community.
- * We distributed over 602,031 pounds of food to clients.
- * The pantry was opened 149 days.
- * Clients received 81.15 pounds of food on average per visit.

While we don't pretend to know why our numbers are down, we know we are still serving people in need.
