We've always had a close relationship with the Foodbank since before the pantry opened, thanks to David Puterbaugh who first came up with the idea of one-day food giveaways which led to the pantry. From those early days the pantry was developed and opened in November, 2010.



Flowers, who is celebrating his 20th year with the Foodbank this year, got a detailed tour of the pantry and



information from many of our pantry leaders. He met with Bruce Helsel, board president; Jim Greiner, Tuesday day manager and pantry treasurer; Jim Perone, board secretary; Cathy Torma, office manager; Joe Cullum, Monday and Tuesday warehouse
