# **MOUNT** UNION SUPPORT. **HALLOWEEN TRADITION**

The help we get from Mount Union students has been consistent since we opened our pantry 15 years ago, and a day in early November was a prime example.

On Halloween students hiked all over town on collecting more than 3,800 pounds of food donated by city residents, and a few days later about 20 students from Beth Simbro's Women's Health Class worked with pantry volunteers to help organize and sort through the food. Others helped rake leaves.

The annual event is organized by the Regula Center under the direction of Abby Schroeder. Mount's Greek organizations and clubs are assigned neighborhoods around the campus where members leave door hangers a few days before Halloween

letting neighbors know they'll be collecting food donations on trick-or-treat night. Over the years the tradition has brought in more than 45,000 pounds of food for the pantry.

Topping this year's competition was Alpha Phi Omega with 989 pounds of food collected, followed by Sigma Alpha Episilon with 666 pounds and Alpha Delta Pi with 538.


Pantry volunteers helping out were Jim Menegay, Sebastian Schubert, Keith Best and Libby and Mike
